



**AMERICAN GUILD OF ORGANISTS -- SUFFOLK CHAPTER
SCHOLARSHIP AWARD PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT - 2018**

The Suffolk Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (Suffolk AGO) is pleased to announce its Fifteenth Annual Organ Scholarship Program for Long Island music students who live in Suffolk County or are members of Suffolk AGO. Three different categories of scholarships are available: *The Sebastian M. Glück College Organ Scholarship*, *The Suffolk Chapter Scholarship for High School and Middle School Students* (Grades 6-12), and *The Scholarship Award for Beginning Organ Students*.

An award of up to \$1,000 for a student pursuing college level organ studies (which may include a high school senior about to enter college or a post HS student studying privately). STUDY REQUIREMENTS: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The student or his or her teacher must be a member of Suffolk AGO. • The funded lessons are to be completed within one year of the award presentation. AUDITIONS All auditions will be held on Friday, May 4, 2018 , at St. Peter's By-the-Sea Episcopal Church, located at 500 S Country Rd, Bay Shore, NY. You will be contacted with an audition time. Please bring the judges FOUR copies of each piece that you will be playing. <i>NOTE: For the GLÜCK COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP ONLY, students who are currently enrolled in college who cannot audition in person may submit an unedited CD recording. The CD must be authenticated by the applicant's music teacher. Copies of the music, CD, and affidavit should be mailed to Dr. Joan Daly-Lewis, 9 Sands Lane, Port Jefferson, NY 11777, and must be received no later than March 31, 2018.</i>		
COLLEGE LEVEL AUDITION REQUIREMENTS Be prepared to play on the organ: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a Prelude/Toccatina and Fugue or Trio Sonata by J. S. Bach, • a piece from the 19th century, • a piece from the 20th or 21st centuries, and (<i>may be single movements from larger works</i>) • two stanzas of one of the following hymns: <i>Lasst uns Erfreuen</i>, <i>Sine Nomine</i>, or <i>Ein Feste Burg</i>. <u>NOTE</u>: the 2nd stanza should be different in some way from the first stanza, 	SECONDARY STUDENT AUDITION REQUIREMENTS Be prepared to play on the organ: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • one piece by J. S. Bach, • a piece from either the 19th, 20th, or 21st centuries, and • two stanzas of one of the following hymns: <i>Hyfrydol</i>, <i>Lobe Den Herren</i>, or <i>St. Anne</i>. <u>NOTE</u>: the 2nd stanza should be different in some way from the first stanza, for instance in registration, key, 	BEGINNING ORGAN STUDENT REQUIREMENTS Play the following on organ or piano: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • one piece for piano or organ, of applicant's choosing • two stanzas of any hymn (from any hymnal, or any book containing simplified hymn arrangements, such as those by Wayne Leupold). Also, provide a brief paragraph about why the candidate would like to study organ. For scholarship recipients under the age of 17, a <i>Statement of Commitment</i> , to be signed by the student, a parent, and the organ teacher will be required.

PRACTICE TIME: AGO Chapter Scholarship applicants (secondary school and college level) will be allowed at least two hours of practice time the week of the auditions. Information regarding practice time will be sent to each Chapter Award applicant sometime in early April.		If requested, applicants for this award will be allowed up to one hour of practice time at the church the week of the audition.
APPLICATIONS and FEE: To apply for one of these awards, review the specific requirements, identify the appropriate scholarship, complete an application and submit it to be postmarked no later than <u>March 29, 2018</u> . Winners will be notified shortly after the auditions, and will be publicly acknowledged at the Annual Scholarship Awards Recital to be held on June 3, 2018. The Scholarship Concert recitalist will be Katelyn Emerson, an exciting young organist, Fulbright scholar, and winner of multiple organ competitions. Katelyn, whose performances have repeatedly been described as “thrilling,” will be honored with a recital at the 2018 National Convention of the AGO in Kansas City (Missouri). We are looking forward to meeting with all eligible applicants at the May 4th auditions. **PLEASE NOTE: College level applicants who are unable to attend the competition auditions in person, and are arranging to send a CD should be prepared to interact with the judges by phone on May 4, 2018, at a time to be specified.**
