SCHOLARSHIP AWARD PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT - 2020**

The Suffolk Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (Suffolk AGO) is pleased to announce its Seventeenth Annual Organ Scholarship Program. Three different categories of scholarships are available: *The Peragallo Scholarship for College Level Applicants*, *The Suffolk Chapter Scholarship for High School and Middle School Students* (Grades 6-12), and *The Carol Landis Memorial Scholarships for Beginning Level Organists*.

<p><i>The Gscheidle Special Recognition Award</i></p>		
<p>Intended to augment the scholarship funding for students who have distinguished themselves through the overall quality of their playing, repertoire selection, and demonstrated commitment to their organ studies in any of the three award categories, up to a maximum of \$300 supplementary funding can be awarded to one or more students as determined by the competition judges. Funds may be spent on lessons, music, or organ shoes.</p>		
<p>AUDITIONS</p>		
<p>All auditions will be held on Friday, May 1, 2020, at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church, located at 48 Greene Ave., Sayville, NY. You will be contacted with an audition time. Please bring the judges FOUR copies of each piece that you will be playing. NOTE: For the PERAGALLO COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP ONLY, students who are currently enrolled in college who cannot audition in person may submit an unedited CD recording. The CD must be authenticated by the applicant's music teacher. Copies of the music, CD, and affidavit should be mailed to Dr. Joan Daly-Lewis, 9 Sands Lane, Port Jefferson, NY 11777, and must be received no later than March 28, 2020.</p>

Also, provide a brief paragraph about why the candidate would like to study organ. For scholarship recipients under the age of 17, a <i>Statement of Commitment</i>, to be signed by the student, a parent, and the organ teacher will be required.</p>
<p>PRACTICE TIME: Secondary school and college level applicants will be allowed at least two hours of practice time the week of the auditions. Information regarding practice time will be sent to each scholarship applicant sometime in early April.</p>		<p>If requested, applicants for this award will be allowed up to one hour of practice time at the church the week of the audition.</p>
<p>APPLICATIONS and FEE: To apply for one of these awards, review the specific requirements, identify the appropriate scholarship, complete an application and submit it to be postmarked no later than <u>April 3, 2020</u>. Winners will be notified shortly after the auditions and will be publicly acknowledged at the Annual Scholarship Awards Recital to be held on June 7, 2020. The 2020 Scholarship Concert recitalist will be Dan Ficarri, an exciting young organist who has been designated as one of the top 20 organists nationally under the age of 30 by *The Diapason* magazine. Dan has been playing solo recitals at such venues as Carnegie Hall, the Cathedral of St. John the Divine and St. Patrick’s Cathedral, even as he pursues an advanced degree at Juilliard. He currently serves as Organ Scholar at the Church of St. Paul the Apostle in Manhattan.

We are looking forward to meeting with all eligible applicants at the May 1st auditions.

PLEASE NOTE: College level applicants who are unable to attend the competition auditions in person and are arranging to send a CD should be prepared, if possible, to interact with the judges by phone on May 1, 2020, at a time to be specified.
