## AMERICAN GUILD OF ORGANISTS -- SUFFOLK CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIP AWARD PROGRAM ANNOUNCEMENT - 2024

The Suffolk Chapter of the American Guild of Organists (Suffolk AGO) is pleased to announce its Nineteenth Annual Organ Scholarship Program. Three different categories of scholarships are available: *The Peragallo Scholarship for College Level Applicants, The Suffolk Chapter Scholarship for High School and Middle School Students* (Grades 6-12), and *The Carol* 

Landis Memorial Scholarships for Beginning Level Organists.

#### The Gscheidle Special Recognition Award

Intended to augment the scholarship funding for students who have distinguished themselves through the overall quality of their playing, repertoire selection, and demonstrated commitment to their organ studies in any of the three award categories, up to a maximum of \$300 supplementary funding can be awarded to one or more students as determined by the competition judges. Funds may be spent on lessons, music, or organ shoes.

### **AUDITIONS**

All auditions will be held on FRIDAY, May 3, 2024, at St. John's Episcopal Church, located at 1670 Route 25A Cold Spring Harbor, NY. You will be contacted with an audition time. Please bring the judges FOUR copies of each piece that you will be playing. NOTE: For the PERAGALLO COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP ONLY, current college students who cannot audition in person may submit an unedited digital file. The files must be authenticated by the applicant's organ teacher. Copies of the digital files and completed affidavit should be emailed to Dr. Joan Daly-Lewis, 9 Sands Lane, Port Jefferson, NY 11777, and must be received no later than April 10, 2024. # COLLEGE LEVEL AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

Be prepared to play on the organ:

• a Prelude/Toccata and Fugue or Trio Sonata by J. S. Bach,

## SECONDARY STUDENT AUDITION REQUIREMENTS

Be prepared to play on the organ:

- one piece by J. S. Bach,
- a piece from either the 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup>.

### BEGINNING ORGAN STUDENT REQUIREMENTS

Play the following on organ or piano:

• one piece for piano or organ, of applicant's choosing

- a piece from the 19<sup>th</sup> century,
- a piece from the 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> centuries, (may be single movements from larger works) and
- two stanzas of one of the following hymns, with a clear introduction: Lasst uns
  Erfreuen, Sine Nomine, or Ein
  Feste Burg. NOTE: the 2nd stanza should be different in some way from the first stanza, for instance in registration, key, or harmonization, and could include an improvisation.
- or 21st centuries, and
- following hymns with a clear introduction: *Hyfrydol, Lobe Den Herren*, or *St. Anne*.

  NOTE: the 2<sup>nd</sup> stanza should be different in some way from the first stanza, for instance in registration, key, or harmonization, etc.

two stanzas of one of the

• two stanzas of any hymn (from any hymnal, or any book containing simplified hymn arrangements, such as those by Wayne Leupold). Please include a hymn introduction.

Also, provide a brief paragraph about why the candidate would like to study organ. For scholarship recipients under the age of 17, a *Statement of Commitment*, to be signed by the student, a parent, and the organ teacher will be required.

**PRACTICE TIME:** Secondary school and college level applicants will be allowed at least two hours of practice time the week of the auditions. Information regarding practice time will be sent to each scholarship applicant sometime in mid-April.

If requested, applicants for this award will be allowed up to one hour of practice time at the church the week of the audition.

APPLICATIONS and FEE: To apply for one of these awards, review the specific requirements, identify the appropriate scholarship, complete an application, and submit it to be received no later than <u>April 10, 2024</u>. The 2024 Scholarship Recitalist will be Matthew Luca, an exciting and talented young performer currently pursuing the master's degree in organ performance at the prestigious Jacob School of Music, while serving as Music Director and Organist at First Presbyterian Church in Martinsville, IN.

We are looking forward to meeting with all eligible applicants at the May 3rd auditions.

### **IMPORTANT NOTES for College Level Applicants:**

- 1. Enrolled college students who are unable to attend the competition auditions in person and are arranging to send a digital file should be prepared to interact with the judges via Zoom on May 3, at a time to be specified.
- 2. College-level applicants must either be enrolled in college OR be under the age of 26 on the day of the auditions.
