

Friday, October 23rd, and Saturday, October 24th, Chant Workshop Weekend with Columba Kelly, OSB



Considered by many to be the leading English-speaking scholar of Gregorian chant, Fr. Columba Kelly, OSB, has since 1964 directed the Schola of St. Meinrad Archabbey, Indiana, composing a body of English-language chants based on the

principles used to create the original Gregorian Chant repertory, that is, based on the natural rhythm of the spoken word.

Fr. Kelly's presentation will be a comprehensive introduction to his revolutionary method, reinforced practically through class singing and conducting of various examples of chant. His workshops have traditionally drawn in musicians and clergy of all denominations.

We are honored to host such a distinguished guest, and we are especially grateful to our Sub-Dean Ray Henderson for all of his hard work in making this a reality. **Look to the next issue of Suffolk Soundings for registration information** on this once-in-a-lifetime event.

“An Organist’s Pilgrimage:”
SAGO Member’s Recital and Organ Crawl
through Glen Cove:

Suffolk Chapter will visit three historic churches in Glen Cove, with presentations given on the buildings as well as the congregations and the organs housed in each. Stops to include St. Paul’s Episcopal Church (1833, with a 1985 Gress-Miles organ), First Presbyterian Church (1876, with a 1909 Reuben Midmer), and St. Rocco’s RC Church, (1933, whose 1977 Peragallo organ was recently renovated by Elsener Organ Works).

The instruments for this program will be comparatively smaller than those featured on our recent Members’ Recitals (each has only two-manuals). It is the chapter board’s hope that members who have not played on any of recent recital programs will play on this program! Certification News

This year our certification exam center administered one Choir Master exam on May 27th, 2015 and one AAGO exam on May 28-29, 2015. Congratulations to the successful candidates! Dean **Matthew Koraus** passed the Choir Master exam and received the Choir Master Prize for scoring the highest on that exam this year. **Michael Haigler**, an NYC chapter member and Director of Music at Christ Church, Oyster Bay, passed the Associate. Special thanks to our Exam Coordinator, Deanna Muro, and to Abiding Presence Lutheran Church, Fort Salonga, and St. John's Episcopal Church, Cold Spring Harbor for hosting the exam sites.

The Suffolk Chapter is very supportive of the educational mission of the AGO. For many years Suffolk AGO has administered the Service Playing and Colleague exams. In 2008, Suffolk AGO was designated as an exam center for the upper level exams, and since then, has been administering the AAGO, FAGO and ChM exams in addition to the CAGO and SPC tests.

As an exam center, the Suffolk Chapter relies on the support of local AGO members. Deanna must recruit judges, proctors and, for the Choir Master exam, singers. Venues must be obtained, practice- and exam-times scheduled, music scores and exam documents distributed, and in some cases, recording equipment must be set up and operated. Suffolk AGO thanks Deanna for serving so ably.
